Submission to the Flag Consideration Panel

I was pleased to see that you are in this role and speaking at the first *Civics and Media Project* workshop on 2 September 2015. The Institute is running the third workshop for this project with the Royal Society on Thursday, 19 November. You and the rest of the Panel would be most welcome to attend this workshop in Wellington.

Please accept this letter and attachment as the McGuinness Institute's submission to the Flag Consideration Panel. The Institute has not engaged in the flag debate as we were concerned that a successful outcome would, in reality, require a deeper conversation.

A discussion on the flag was always at risk of being about the design and how that design was perceived globally rather than what the design meant to New Zealanders in terms of driving our values and behaviour going forward. However, we do recognise that the flag debate might provide a useful mechanism for starting a deeper discussion and for that reason we consider the current flag initiative to be an idea worth pursuing.

In 2011 the Institute undertook a workshop that might be of interest. It was called *StrategyNZ: Mapping Our Future*, and during the workshop we asked the 100 participants to create a coat of arms, among other outputs. The coat of arms output was chosen as opposed to a flag because we considered that it would prove more significant and informative by illustrating the types of products, services and values that could drive our country forward. I have attached a copy of the final workshop output booklet for your information.
