We wonder whether New Zealand is in the same situation. To help provide clarity over this, would you be able to answer the following three questions:

- 1. Who is responsible for managing the stocktake of intensive care drugs in New Zealand?
- 2. What is 'the medical name' of all the intensive care drugs that are on the list to collect and store (especially those that are useful for treating patients with COVID-19)?
- 3. Please list the quantities that MoH has in stock of each 'intensive care drug' (especially those that are useful for treating patients with COVID-19)?

We consider this is important information given the government is moving to alert 3 before the virus is eliminated.
