

LocalNZ workshop programme, Version 3

21 November 2014

The research question for this workshop was: *In your opinions, how do regional goals align with national goals, and how do these need to change in order to aid regional growth?* This workshop connected 35 New Zealanders between the ages of 18 and 25, providing a space for them to work together to identify existing and emerging opportunities and challenges.




Day 3: Tuesday, 18 November 2014


