Good morning Wendy

Northland DHB's comments on the draft paper are as follows:

Our principal concern would be that you have drawn conclusions about DHBs' ability to provide PPE to our communities. DHBs do not carry stock to provide for the community, the Ministry of Health does. The graphs about deprivation and Māori population percentages and PPE availability are flawed as they are based on the assumption we supply the community with PPE.

The other point is that the purpose of the OIA as noted in the appendix has not been answered in the paper's recommendations and in fact there is no correlation between the summary or recommendations to the noted reasons in the OIA.

For the Northland DHB part our glove calculation looks wrong. We suggest that you have used the box number then calculated the amount per person as 8 instead basing your calculations on the total gloves per box – at 17 August 2020 Northland DHB had 556,312 gloves on hand.
