- 3. The results will be written up in the new year and sent to each DHB, the Minister of Health and the Ministry of Health.





Figure 2: UK outpatient attendances – 2019–2021

- 4. Our aim is to contribute to the development of a health care system that is able to withstand surges of COVID-19 variants, as well as be ready for future pandemics and environmental disasters (e.g. eruptions and earthquakes). To do this, we see this survey as a way to learn more about the issues DHBs currently face and the broader challenges that may exist for the health care system going forward. We see this as a one-off opportunity given the reforms planned in July 2022 to centralise the health care system. The pandemic is disrupting health care systems globally (see the UK experience in Figures 1 and 2). The Institute considers COVID-19 a moderate pandemic; we need to not only manage the current pandemic but also prepare our health care system for a possible severe pandemic in the near future.
- 5. The Institute has made these questions available as a SurveyMonkey survey so they are easier for DHB staff to complete and for Institute staff to collate in a timely manner.
- 6. The Institute has a *PandemicNZ* project, which started in 2005 and includes a COVID-19 timeline (found here), a Situational Report as at 1 September 2021 (found here) and a suggested integrated health care strategy (found here).
- 7. The COVID-19 National Hospital Response Framework (version 4) is referenced in several of the following survey questions. If your DHB does not have a copy of this framework, please see here.



Figure 1: UK elective procedures – 2019–2021
