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Climate Implications of Policy Assessment Framework: Report Back

Portfolio Climate Change

On 25 June 2020, the Cabinet Environment, Energy and Climate Committee

- noted the importance of monitoring and disclosing the impact on greenhouse gas emissions of policy proposals and decisions;
- **noted** that the Climate Implications Policy Assessment (CIPA) has been operative since 1 November 2019;
- noted that the current emissions threshold above which the CIPA requirement applies (250,000 tonnes CO2-e per annum) is too high to capture likely future proposals that will have a significant impact on emissions;
- 4 **agreed** that the emissions threshold for the CIPA requirement be amended to:
 - 4.1 the impact on greenhouse gas emissions is likely to be equal to or above 0.5 million tonnes CQ2-e within the first ten years of the proposal period; or
 - 4.2 for forestry related proposals, the impact on greenhouse gas emissions is likely to be equal to or above three million tonnes of CO2-e within the first 30 years of the proposal period;
- agreed that the Cabinet Office circular on the CIPA requirements [CO (19) 8] be updated to reflect the new threshold;
- noted that agencies will be expected to apply the new threshold once the Cabinet Office circular on the CIPA requirements has been updated, and the Ministry for the Environment will support them to do this;
- noted that under certain exceptional circumstances, the CIPA requirement will not apply, and that the Minister for Climate Change will consider any proposals that seek an exemption of the CIPA requirement due to exceptional circumstances and will grant these on a case by case basis:
- 8 **noted** that Ministry for the Environment officials will continue to provide quantitative analysis support under the established CIPA technical support function;
- 9 **noted** that the disclosure of indirect impacts will continue as a voluntary option;

noted that work is underway to develop an approach to associate a dollar value with emissions and emission reductions over time, which could be incorporated into CIPA disclosures to provide additional information to decision makers, and that the Minister for Climate Change will report back to Cabinet on this work in due course;

11 **noted** that:

- work is underway to develop a tool or methods to consider the effects of climate change in investment and policy decisions and in regulatory system reviews;
- 11.2 the Minister for Climate Change will seek Cabinet decisions on these proposals in November 2020.
