### Our OIA 2025/02: Request for information on climate-related Cabinet papers

We are treating the new questions below as a new OIA, although the OIA 2024/13 requests in May 2024 and October 2024 are related (see the schedule on our website here).

#### Working Paper 2025/03: List of Climate-related Cabinet papers, dated 2001-2024 (WIP)

The Institute is currently in the process of completing Working Paper 2025/03: List of Climate-related Cabinet papers Dated 2001–2024. This working paper aims to create a list of all climate-related Cabinet papers, and accompanying Cabinet Committee and Cabinet minutes that have been produced and proactively released between 2001 and 31 December 2024. The Institute's intention is to ensure that there is a comprehensive list of Cabinet papers that set out New Zealand's public policy response to climate change.

The February 2025 table (see here and Excel attached) has been updated. The new 2025 table takes into account:

- (i) Your 2024 correspondence:
- (ii) Cabinet papers published between May 2024 and 31 December 2024;
- (iii) Chapter 5: Cabinet Decision-making in the 2023 Cabinet Manual (see here); and
- (iv) A new definition. A 'climate-related Cabinet paper' is a Cabinet paper that:
  - a. Discusses risks, costs and/or opportunities that climate change may create.
  - b. Discusses how New Zealand might adapt to or mitigate the impacts of climate change over the long-term.
  - c. The content is forward-looking, strategic (rather than operational) and of significant scale.

Given the above, we made the following changes:

Made minor title changes to better reflect the content of the Cabinet paper (as in some cases only the titles of the accompanying minutes had been given);

Added individual columns for the Cabinet paper, the accompanying Cabinet Committee minute and finally the Cabinet minute (see Figure 1 below) to better reflect the decision-making process of Cabinet;

Included Cabinet papers (and their accompanying minutes) that had previously been missed by the Institute. This resulted in the addition of 25 Cabinet papers (see green rows in attached Excel); and

Removed Cabinet papers that did not meet our refined definition of 'climate-related' (see criteria above). This resulted in the removal of 35 Cabinet papers.

#### New questions

There are four parts to this request.

### Part One: Cabinet decision-making process

Q1: Does Figure 1 below accurately reflect the standard process for Cabinet decision-making? Please provide any suggestions or additions you have to the text or stages.

Q2: We have noticed that in most cases Cabinet papers do not have a reference number stated in the document itself. In these cases, can we assume these papers have the same reference number as the related Cabinet/Cabinet committee minute? This is what we have assumed, see excerpt of Excel in box below.

Thank you for your previous responses to our initial OIA.

The Institute has incorporated all your changes and suggestions. The updated excel is attached (version 2). We have also updated the table on our website (see <a href="here">here</a>) for alignment. Unfortunately, these changes create new gaps (see red text in excel). It would be great if you could complete and send the excel back. We will then incorporate and reload the excel into a table on our webiste.

FYI: The two major changes to the excel, suggested by three departments (through either correspondence or the formatting of their response), were (i) providing the committee reference and date as well as the Cabinet reference and date (or vice versa), and (ii) the creation of a new column (Col E) which lists the accompanying minute to the Cabinet paper listed in Col D.

We have also had the format of the Excel reviewed by Cabinet Office to ensure the information in the table is presented clearly. Cabinet Office also recommended minor changes to the titles of Cols B and D and information in Col H. These changes have all been incorporated.
