## Our OIA 2025/03: Request for data non-migrated to Aotearoa Data Explorer

The Institute is in the process of updating a number of our infographics, previously published in 2020 (see [link to our YouTube](#)). The purpose is to illustrate change over time from 1899–2024. It does not look at the change in the pie but the change in the proportion of the pie.

As part of this process, we have been reviewing our references that were used and encountered an issue relating to data from 2000 and 2010. This data was originally sourced from NZ.Stat, and appears not to have been migrated to 'Aotearoa Data Explorer' following the closure of 'NZ.Stat website' in September 2024. While we have the data in our system and have confidence in it, we would greatly appreciate having access to the source that was previously used for our records. An example of the data we are looking for is shown far below. This leads us to the following requests:

**Question 1:** Could you please provide the data for (i) New Zealand exports by country of destination and (ii) New Zealand imports by country of source for the years of 2000 and 2010 for the 12 months to 31 June?

**Question 2:** Could you please provide the data for (i) New Zealand exports by type commodity and (ii) New Zealand imports by type of commodity for the years of 2000 and 2010 for the 12 months to 31 June?
