
New Zealand daily life: overseas dependencies and threats

Cables

Globally, 95% of global data (including financial transactions and transcontinental internet traffic) is carried by undersea cables. Furthermore, most of our data is stored offshore. A large proportion of New Zealand Government data is stored on an Amazon-owned cloud storage data centre offshore, raising access and privacy issues.⁸ Threats to the cables include climate change, volcanic activity⁹ and seabed warfare.¹⁰ Here a contract of the cables include climate change, volcanic activity⁹ and seabed warfare.¹⁰

3 Chinese warships from the People's Liberation Army – Navy (PLA-N) Task Group sail unexpectedly around Australia's east coast in February 2025. The New Zealand Defence Force, in conjunction with the Australian Defence Force, monitor their movements closely.¹¹ **343** potentially nationally significant cyber security incidents occur in New Zealand for the year to June 2024 (110 have links to suspected state-sponsored actors).¹²

33 serious hazards and security threats are listed on New Zealand's National Risk Register.¹³
