**Request for information: Procurement process of personal protective equipment for the National Reserve Supply (NRS)**

Thank you for your request dated 15 April 2026 under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA). Your original request is attached at the end of this letter.

For clarity, we have addressed your queries below:

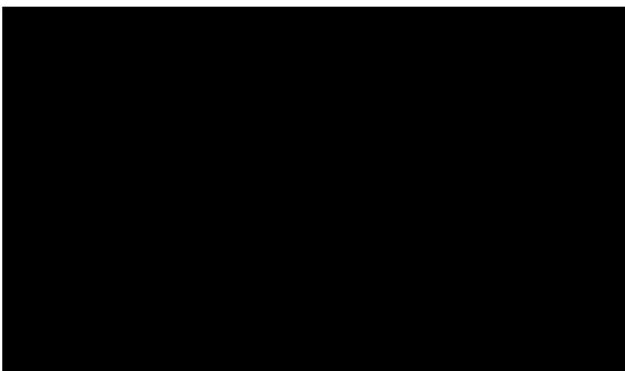
- 1. Has this procurement process (see letter dated 23 May 2024) resulted in an increase in the quantity of the NRS PPE?**

**Response:** Purchasing of medical devices including personal protective equipment (PPE) is led by Health New Zealand (HNZ). Pharmac is not aware of any bulk purchasing of PPE having been completed by Health NZ since the implementation of the contracts on 1 April 2026.

- 2. Has this procurement process resulted in any new contracts with *New Zealand suppliers* to manufacture PPE for supply to the NRS? If yes, please advise the *duration* of these contracts and the *types* of PPE being supplied to the NRS.**
- 3. Has this procurement process resulted in any new contracts with *overseas suppliers* to manufacture PPE for supply to the NRS? If yes, please advise *what countries*, *what durations* and *what types* of PPE?**

**Response to question 2 and 3:**

Through this process, contracts were established with 11 suppliers. These suppliers are:

All suppliers are registered New Zealand limited companies. Country of residence was identified as New Zealand by six suppliers, Australia by four suppliers and the United Kingdom by one supplier.

The contracts have an initial term of two years, with right of renewals allowing up to two additional one-year extensions, resulting in a maximum potential term of four years. The personal protective equipment supplied to the NRS under these contracts includes isolation gowns, aprons, and procedure masks.

4. **Has Pharmac undertaken or plan to undertake further round/s of invitations for ROIs for the procurement of PPE for the NRS? If yes, please explain in detail and provide correspondence.**

**Response:** Pharmac has not. The PPE category is transitioning to Health NZ in the next couple of months. Any new PPE procurement or contracting activity will be managed by Health NZ.

5. **Do you rely on the *National Health Emergency Plan: National Reserve Supplies Management and Usage Policies, 3rd edition (2013)* (directly or indirectly) when undertaking a procurement process?**

6. **Please provide links to any other documents or guidance Pharmac relies on when undertaking procurement processes for stocking the NRS?**

**Response to questions 5 and 6:**

Pharmac did not directly rely on the *National Health Emergency Plan: National Reserve Supplies Management and Usage Policies, 3rd edition (2013)*. However, throughout the process, we engaged with HNZ subject-matter experts. They made significant contributions to the requirements and the evaluation of the PPE, which may have been informed by the National Health Emergency Plan.
